Fellow, Department of Adolescent Medicine, The New Children's Hospital, Westmead/ Sydney, Australia:

The Fellowship involved inpatients and outpatients at the Department of Adolescent Medicine, inpatients of the Adolescent Medical Unit (Westmead Hospital), medical care for at risk young people in a community based youth service (High Street Youth Health Service), adolescent subspecialty clinics and adolescent and paediatric gynaecology, Family Planning, and Sexual Health. Gynaecology clinics included clinics at the Department of Adolescent Medicine, Westmead Hospital Adolescent Gynaecology Clinic and Sydney Children's Hospital Adolescent Gynaecology Clinic.

In 1998/1999, the focus was on managing patients with eating disorders, general adolescent patients, and paediatric/adolescent gynaecology patients. During 2000, the principal challenge was pioneering and establishing the position of the *Chronic Illness/Transition Fellow*, in order to meet the multiple needs of young people with chronic illness and facilitate coordinated care and transition to adult services. This involved attending subspecialty clinics working with consultants, allied health team members and participating in groupwork programs associated with subspecialty clinics as Renal, Cystic Fibrosis, Diabetes, Immunology and Infectious Diseases, and Rehabilitation.

2001/2002: Joint Fellowship in Adolescent Medicine and Psychological Medicine. This fellowship was a position focusing on coordinating and managing chronic illness and transition issues among adolescents attending both departments. Placement within the Department of Psychological Medicine provided training opportunities in the assessment of young people with depression, anxiety, neuropsychiatry and neurodevelopmental problems. Special training was attended in family therapy and cognitive behavioural therapy. Involvement with paediatric/adolescent gynaecology clinic and ongoing management of general adolescent outpatient caseload continued.
